# I'D DRIVE IT ANYWHERE

When North Carolina resident David Farmer decided he wanted to purchase an older vehicle for restoration, he didn't know exactly what type he wanted. Of course there's plenty to choose from through years covering all ranges of cost and all ranges of restoration needs. Ultimately it was Mustang that caught David's eye — the early model fastback design to be exact.

Rather than going into this project blind, David began talking with folks he knew who owned Mustangs and searched a favorite trader publication

for possibilities. While the search was underway in 1991, a Mustang restorer with 20 years of experience under his belt was located and asked for advice. David received a good lesson in how to determine if a Mustang had been wrecked, if the frame rails were bent, and if the floor pans were in need of replacement.

Several months and several fruitless phone calls passed before what seemed to be the perfect 1966 fastback was located. Phone calls throughout the day paid off when the owner was finally reached. What greeted David was a white fastback adorned with blue stripes. Turns out the owner was planning to convert the pony into GT 350 status. It was obvious that there was some work to be done, but David tells us, "I got under the wheel and started down the highway. That little 289 with the four-speed transmission gave me such a sense of power under me that I realized that this was the car I wanted." The white fastback, sans

stripes, obtained a new owner on January 28, 1992.

A thorough investigation at home revealed several surprises. The brakes were sporting new springs, shoes, and wheel cylinders while new rubber was found in the front suspension. Decoding of the data plate revealed a 1966 fastback that was built on October 22, 1965 at the San Jose plant with a 289 2V/four-speed combo, air conditioning, 2.80 rear gearing, DSO 65 (Oklahoma City), and a color code of Y. Y? It seems the little pony originally wore a coat of Silver Blue paint.

This brought about an entirely new set of challenges. So it was off to local car shows and more conversations with Mustang owners to determine just exactly what was needed to make the fastback worthy of concours driven status. David entered the car in his first MCA National in 1995. "I entered my car in Concours Driven and won a Bronze award because of a very understanding judge. I was so proud of that trophy that I became a diehard Mustang fan. That also made me want to do a very detailed



job on my car from the engine to the trunk compartment to detailing the underneath."

Work began in earnest with the blue interior. Everything was taken out, appropriate pieces painted the correct shade of blue, and the headliner dyed in what may be a somewhat unorthodox manner. "The headliner was dyed by my son Gregory and myself. We started this in the winter by taping off the windows and trim. We cranked the car up and got it warm inside by using the heater. We used a dye from a spray can and the headliner looks like a new one. We got it to dry quickly by using my wife's and daughter's hair dryers!"



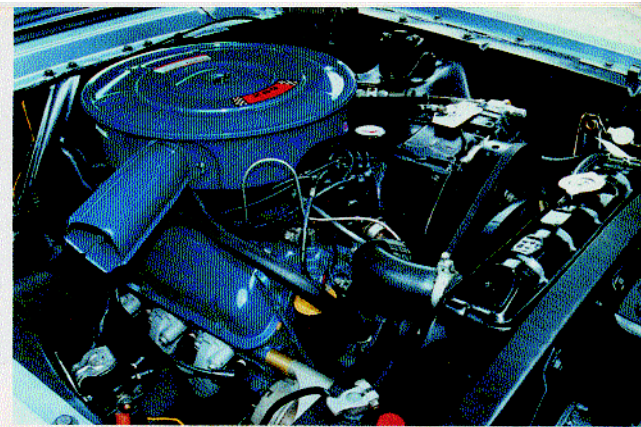
Ronnie Smith of Smith Paint & Body Shop applied coats of Dupont Centura 2000 in the correct shade of Silver Blue to the exterior. (David pointed out that his Silver Blue fastback used to be about the only one seen at most Nationals, but more have started turning out.)

Detailing of the engine compartment was next on the list with assistance from friend Mike Jones who just happens to be a mechanic. While the engine was out, more surprises came to light. "In checking the clutch, pressure plate, and throw-out bearing, we realized that they all needed replacing. That meant the fly wheel needed turning along with a new ring gear. We took it to Don Lane's machine shop and found out that the flywheel lip was cracked about five to six inches. The oil pan was pulled to replace the rear main seal which revealed a few small chunks of metal."

With all this other work going on this seemed as good a time as any to add a high performance cam. It was at then that the question as to the origins of the chunks of metal was answered — the bottom of the first cam bearing was missing. By the time it was all said and done, the engine was bored 0.030-over with everything replaced except for the connecting rods and valves.

In an effort to learn as much as possible about the car, David contacted his state department of motor vehicles. "I noticed from one of the titles that it had an Arizona address which matched a receipt I found in the glove box for a windshield replacement. One of the North Carolina titles had a Greensboro address. I wrote to this address and a in a few months received a two-page letter from Stephen Chambers who had owned the car and brought it to North Carolina. Mr. Chambers purchased the fastback in 1989 while stationed at Williams Air Force Base in Mesa, Arizona.

"In his letter to me he related the story of when he went to pick up the car. He purchased it from the Rentschler family in Prescott,



Arizona. When he left with the car he turned and looked back. They were all standing on the sidewalk crying. He said it made him feel bad for a while but the further he drove down the interstate, the better he got to feeling."

Now after nine years of ownership, David and his fastback have plenty of stories to share including one from their early days together. While visiting at a friend's house, this little pony broke loose, rolled across the street into another yard and hit a tree damaging the rear bumper. The bumper was easily replaced but David said it was an "empty and sad feeling" when he thought his car had been stolen.

"Now after all the work that has been done on the car, I would not be afraid to drive this '66 anywhere." And he has the gold awards to prove it.

# Mustang Club of America Celebrates 25 years

With the inception of the Mustang Club of America in 1976, club founders focused on what we now deem the first generation of Mustang, 1964 1/2 - 1973. Bear in mind that this took place two years after the introduction of the Mustang II. To be quite frank about it, some of those founding folks just didn't particularly care for the dramatically changed pony (no offense II owners). Shows, activities, information, classified advertising, etc., covered only the first generation ponies.

By 1983-84, however, some MCA officials were taking note of the revitalized interest in new Mustangs. The cars were continuously improving, sales were decent, and reports were that this latest trend in Mustang was also a lot of fun. (It didn't hurt either that a convertible was once again in the line-up). By late 1985, a very quiet movement began to change the minds of those who thought that MCA should continue to exclude the new cars.

As the movement progressed, discussions became very long and at times heated during MCA Board meetings.

Eventually, a change to the club by-laws was proposed to the Board of Directors and the matter came to a vote. Not surprisingly it was defeated. Those individuals spearheading the change patiently waited the required amount of time before the by-laws change was brought up for vote again. On May 13, 1986, the Mustang Club of America Board of Directors approved the motion to open the club to all years of Mustang.

The following is from an editorial written by yours truly in the June 1986 Mustang Times —

"By accepting the late model Mustangs, we are opening our doors to thousands of new members and a tremendous storehouse of information. By increasing our membership we will be able once again to offer more benefits and further improve many of our current membership benefits. This is not to say the transition is going to be easy. The only way this will be successful is if all of us work together. It has taken MCA ten years to get where we are today in terms of judging rules, knowledge of the first generation Mustangs, and publishing Mustang Times. The work will be hard and sometimes painfully slow in learning about the second generation Mustangs, but this can be done with everyone's support.

"...Now we truly are the Mustang Club of America, not the 1964 1/2 - 1973 Mustang Club of America.

"MCA has done well for itself in ten years and the difference from day one until now is amazing. There is a new breed of Mustang owner out there waiting for a quality club to come along that will accept their new GT or SVO. The Mustang Club of America is it — no doubt about it."

As one who was there in the midst of this change, it was not an easy task to accomplish. There were numerous diehard early model fans who simply refused to change their minds on the direction of the club.

In retrospect, it's actually quite amazing that MCA was able to survive those first ten years limiting itself to only a particular segment of the Mustang world. The truly odd thing is that our membership roll was between 5,000 and 6,000.

It is said that timing is everything, and MCA is fortunate to have had enough forward-thinking folks in place to push the change through. Without it, this writer ventures to guess that MCA would either be an extremely small club or nonexistent.

Stay with us as we celebrate MCA's silver anniversary. M2

# Team Mustang

From Art Hyde, Mustang Chief Program Engineer and Team Mustang Members

Over the past months, we have been talking about the things I think the Mustang Club of America should consider to attract younger members (Millennials). As you may recall, those things were:

- Compelling benefits associated with membership.
- More activities and multimedia opportunities at the events.
- More emphasis on late model modified and daily drivers.
- Better integration and visibility of community service into the events.
- Web site enhancements for learning, fun and commerce.
- Brochures in new Mustangs.

These things may sound great conceptually, but all of them represent change to the present membership. Mustang Club of America is possibly the world's best club for large single marque concours shows. The AACA (Antique Automobile Club of America), the BMW, Corvette, and Porsche clubs may all have more members, but none have put on an event the size and quality of the 35th Mustang Anniversary Celebration in Charlotte. Just as the Mustang cannot become a four-door, a station wagon, or front-wheel-drive without corrupting its brand, MCA should not venture too far from its essence in its quest for younger members. This does not mean, however, that things do not have to change. The insights I have shared were intended to start a discussion about what types of changes we should consider as we evolve the club.

Since we all have limited time and energy, we need to find common threads that run through areas of interest to Millennials and that are natural extensions of our foundation. One underlying connection comes to mind quickly — we need to increase the value we get from our membership roster to fund more activities at events, benefits, and services. For example, to get a sponsor to provide a discount on merchandise, we need to convince them that there is a business opportunity. The way you do that is to show that the membership is large enough and is likely to purchase their product or service. We would need much more data about our members and we would need to have sophisticated database analysis capabilities to make this case. Additionally, we would need to provide some way for the sponsors to contact the membership so that they can realize the business potential. The trick would be doing this without violating the trust or privacy of the members.

Right now, MCA has only names, addresses, and membership renewal dates. To make the case to sponsors, we would need other information such as E-mail, phone, age



group, gender, income group, family composition, and information on products and services used today. This could open the door to both problems and opportunities. It needs to be thought out carefully before we proceed. I hope this will be an active topic for debate this year.

The challenge to your Board of Directors is to lead and control change in an evolutionary manner, one step ahead of our comfort zone, but slow enough that the membership is not left behind. Bill Johnson (MCA president) is setting up a broad coalition of long-timers and newer members to help chart this course.

Now, on to your questions this month —

**Q. I'm the proud owner of a 2000 GT coupe, Performance Red color. I would like to know some information about this pony. Can you help me? What were the production numbers (all) for year 2000? How many coupes with Performance Red color? How many with automatic transmission? According to the VIN (1FAFP42XXYF146685), what number is my pony?**

A. 2000 model year was a big year for Mustang. Not only was the auto industry at record levels, but it was a long year for Mustang — 2000 model year vehicles were built for 13 months (August 1999 to September 2000). As a result of the strong industry and the long year, we built a 20-year record volume of 203,000 Mustangs. The specific data you requested is as follows:

I can't pinpoint exactly how many vehicles have the distinction to match the specifications of your car closer than that with the data I have. I didn't have time to find out what number your car is. I will report that back next month.

**Q. My son asked me why we don't see many Mustang commercials on television and I didn't have an answer. Is it because you sell as many as you can build? Even so, it would be nice to see a Mustang GT cruising on a desert road at Mach speeds. I'm sure it would give an extra boost to Ford's image with the younger generation.**

A. It's true that Mustang has been running at full capacity since November 1998. The reason we have not been advertising is due to a Company decision to focus advertising on other brands that have lower recognition (like Focus and Escape), higher profits (like Explorer and Expedition) or more volume potential (like Taurus or Windstar). That has been our strategy for as long as I can remember. Besides, Mustang gets an unusually large share of dealer advertising, showroom space, and exposure in popular media (movies and TV). We typically only run Mustang TV ads when a new Mustang is introduced.

While it is true we could improve awareness and aspiration interest in Mustang with TV ads, I don't think it's a good value. TV ads cost big money for a very short duration on a media that is increasingly fragmented. I think it is better to put our limited budget into magazines, events, and dealer promotion and contribute the leftover into our new product fund. With exciting new products maybe we can entice the media (print and TV) to give up play for free. What do you think?

**Q. I bought a 1996 Cobra convertible new from a dealership in Albuquerque, New Mexico. Because of the altitude in Albuquerque, the car came equipped with an optional "high altitude compensator" engine. Initially the folks at SVT informed me that only 10 Cobra convertibles were produced with this compensator. (I asked SVT for documentation but now they say they can't determine a number made. Is there any way to confirm the number?) The service manual contains no information on this engine option. Where can I get more information (what exactly is it, what does it include and do, etc.)?**

A. The engine is not different from the normal 49-State Cobra. There is no special high altitude compen-

sator engine. All the calibrations we use have the ability to compensate for air pressure difference due to altitude so that optimized performance, fuel economy, and emissions is delivered. We did (and still do) list a "high altitude emissions option" which was in reality an emission certification with no hardware or software associated with it. That is why it does not appear in the service manual.

The records I have indicate that 98 Cobra convertibles produced in 1996 Model Year had this "high altitude option." Of those Cobra convertibles, 87 were shipped to the Denver sales region that includes Albuquerque. That's as fine as I can cut the data. Hope this helps.

**Q. A few years ago the Cobra was available with a removable hardtop option. A buddy and I have an ongoing disagreement on this option. I say that only a few were produced and the option dropped because the supplier couldn't meet demand. He says it all centered around problems that included fit and quality. Are either one of us right?**

A. We did offer a removable hardtop on the Cobra in 1995. We produced around 300 vehicles equipped with this option. The supplier immediately had trouble meeting paint quality standards during the production launch. We had our experts work with them but without success. We also found we could not affordably bring the painting in-house to solve the problem. After several unsuccessful gyrations, we were compelled to drop the option.

Developing the hardtop was very difficult. In addition to the paint issue, the major challenges were sealing, squeaks and rattles, durability, fit and weight. We have fed this experience upstream to the team that is responsible for the new Thunderbird hardtop early in their effort. Looking at the new Thunderbirds I have seen with porthole tops, it seems the Thunderbird benefitted from our lessons learned.

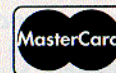

# Shifty Business

## Installing New Ripper Shifter is a Breeze

While Mustang muscle cars are certainly well equipped from the factory, performance driving sometimes requires parts that are better than stock. Maybe that's why the Ford Racing Performance Parts catalog is so popular with so many Mustang aficionados. One of the products in that catalog you'll appreciate every time you're behind the wheel is B & M's M-7210-L Ripper shifter for five- and six-speed manual transmissions.

As we discussed briefly in a previous article, shifters for 5.0L Mustangs went through a number of changes during the '80s and '90s. The 1983 5.0 Mustang had a long-throw shifter from the factory that was replaced two years later with a unit that required noticeably less effort when running through the gears. In 1990, Ford returned to the long throw T-5 shifter which was carried over into the SN95 model run in 1994.

Over the years, many owners have complained about the sloppy, spongy feel of the factory three-piece shifter which seemed to worsen with age. Much of that is attributed to the isolation block which connects with two bolts. Designed to help reduce vibrations, the insulator bushings on these units can often deteriorate over time and loosen which is why many parts houses offer replacement

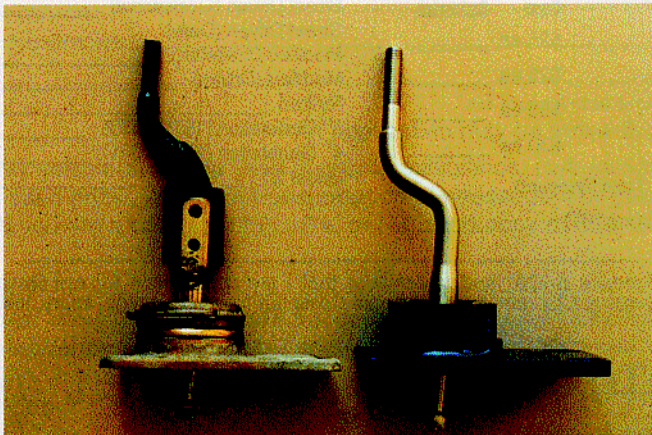
stainless steel bushings for the T-5.

In the case of our 159,000-mile LX coupe, we decided to go with the Ripper shifter that's featured in the 2001 FRP catalog. Designed as a direct replacement for all 1983-98 Mustangs with the Borg Warner T-4, T-5, or T-45 manual transmission, this shifter comes with a number of features such as a solid billet steel stick, heavy duty aluminum base, and a limited lifetime warranty. More important, however, are the shorter strokes and the adjustable stops which can prevent you from bending or breaking the shift fork under hard acceleration.

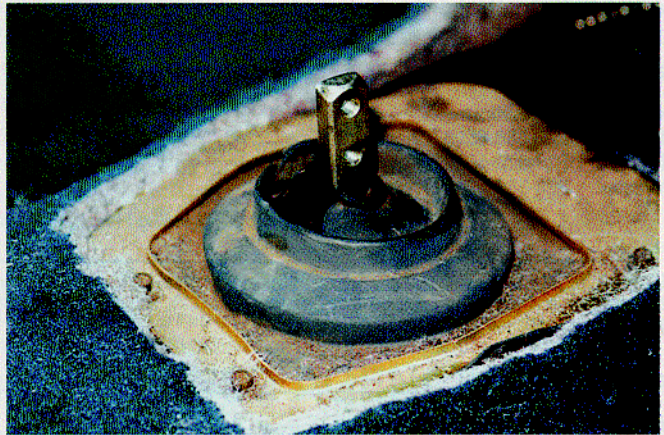
Although a job like this might seem a bit scary to some novices, it really is a breeze. The first step is to simply unscrew the shifter knob and put it aside. The new shifter doesn't come with a knob, so you'll need to re-install the used one or select another knob with M12-1.75 threads. Carefully pry the hard plastic cover plate which secures the leather boot from the console being careful not to break any of the plastic clips needed for reassembly. Then, unbolt the upper part of the stick from the lower portion of the shifter.

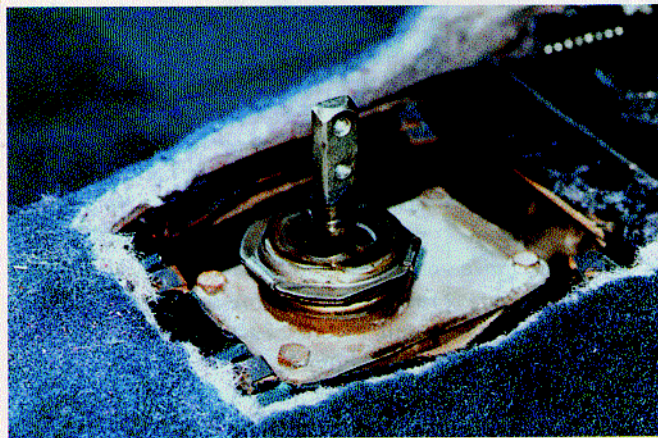
What you'll see is a stamped steel plate and lower boot assembly which can be removed with four bolts. Unfortunately, it's not as easy as it sounds due to the

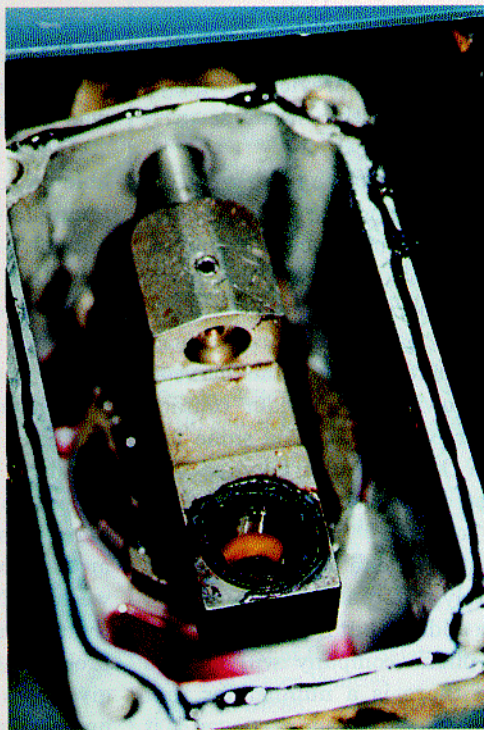

restricted access you'll have with the console in place. In the accompanying photos, we removed the console in order for our readers to have a better view. Doing this with the console still in the car is possible, but it's going to take a little patience and swearing.

With this out, remove the four bolts that secure the bottom part of the shifter to the transmission. Pry the cover loose carefully with a flat-bladed screwdriver. RTV silicone is used as a sealer between the two, so it shouldn't take much effort. Just be patient and take your time. Once done, carefully scrape away all of the old sealer and inspect the plastic bushing for signs of damage or wear.

After you get to this point, it's all down hill from here. Each B & M Ripper comes with stop screws that can be adjusted to limit the amount of shifter travel to your own particular tastes. Follow the manufacturer's instructions as you'll want to approximate the stock pattern before

you install the shifter. Adjustments can be made rather easily with an Allen key and box wrench.

Run a bead of new RTV silicone along the top surface perimeter of the transmission, allow time for this to skin over, and then mount the Ripper using the new M8-1.25 x 25mm socket head bolts instead of the old stock bolts. Install the new lower boot with the retaining ring provided and reverse the procedures above to finish the installation.

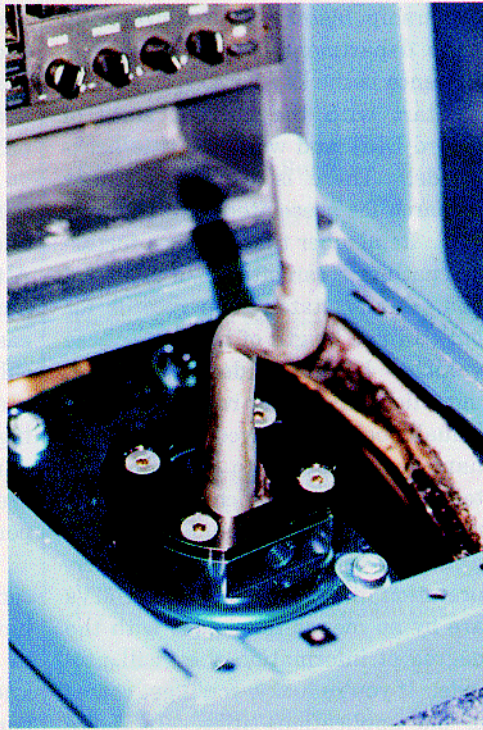
If a stock appearance is important, you'll be pleased to know that virtually no one will be aware of the switch as the stock shift knob and original leather boot will hide every trace of the non-stock unit. Another worthwhile point is that while you can order this M-7210-L shifter from any Ford dealership, you may also get the same unit from any number of aftermarket supply houses under B & M part number 45050.

# Tracing a Pony's Past

So, you want to trace your car's history? Sounds simple enough, but as they say "it's easy when you don't know how!"

Researching a car's past is a slow process that often leads to frustrating dead ends. Sometimes the breakthroughs come quickly, sometimes painfully slow. But when you find the missing link, the satisfaction is unbeatable. I've had mixed results researching the history of cars over the years. Here are some of the tricks and lessons I've learned along the way.

The natural starting point would seem to be the original selling dealership. Unfortunately, even with the dealership name in hand you may find that it is no longer in business or has changed hands or been renamed several times. Plus, if you do locate the proper dealership, it is doubtful that they will have any records or personnel available from the time period you seek. Remember, these folks are in the business of selling *new* cars and may not be particularly interested in your old car.

Probably the best way to obtain ownership history is to contact the state department of motor vehicles. Patience is the key here.

Start with the current state of record DMV and work the title backwards. There is usually a minor research fee associated with this service. Remember that this is a torturous path that can often lead to a dead end. Many states keep records for only a fixed length of time. As these vehicles become older and older, microfiche and paper records are continually being destroyed. Most DMVs have switched over to computer systems making microfiche and paper records harder to dig up.

States vary widely in their interpretation of the privacy act so DMVs are by no means consistent with the degree of information they will provide. If you're lucky, you'll get copies of old applications/titles. If you're not, you may only get a name. In any

case you certainly will not get a telephone number. Once you have completed the process in one state, move on to the next and start over.

Despite all this research, it may be next to impossible to determine all the true owners of your car. The DMV tracks only registered owners and through the years, the car's title may have unofficially changed hands a few times. Often cars are traded from one dealer to another without record. Also, a prior owner may never have retitled the vehicle in his name. If the prior owner was in the military, veteran organizations keep excellent records of their whereabouts.

Don't forget about a relative, friend or helpful club member who may live in the area you are researching. Internet chat groups are a great resource nowadays. Private investigators are another source, but detective work is expensive. These professionals have numerous tricks and are privy to information that most of us simply can not get. With the cost of long distance phone calls and a possible cross-country trip or two, professional investigators may even end up cheaper in the long run! If there is a possibility that a previous owner is dead, a call to the social security office will confirm this.

Once your research has revealed a list of names, phone numbers and/or addresses must be acquired. Although the Internet has made phone number/e-mail searches much easier, I've made hundreds of phone calls to people with the same name as previous owners. Consider contacting other people with the same last name in the particular town as they are often relatives or children of the person you seek.

Unlisted phone numbers pose a completely different problem. If you have an address but no number, a call to the phone company will let you know if there is a number for that person at the same address even if it is unlisted. You can request that the

operator make a call to the unlisted number for you asking that the person call you back collect. If the person responds, you will have a permanent record of the phone number on your phone bill.

Letters are a last ditch effort, but sometimes a letter can be forwarded to the previous owner's new address. Sending a letter certified/return receipt requested gives the letter the priority status you may need to encourage the recipient to respond. Keep the letter simple but include pertinent information. To encourage a response, include a simple yes/no questionnaire and a self-addressed, stamped envelope. Also be sure to include your phone number and request that you be called collect.

I have found that most folks are very helpful and seem fascinated that I'm going to all this trouble for an old car. At the same time, however, many people are jaded with telephone solicitations so don't waste their time. Keep your introduction short and to the point. Write down a plausible introduction and use it each time you make a call. Be upbeat and don't forget to properly thank the person for their time and help even if the call was of little use to you.

Every previous owner I have been able to contact has been more than happy to talk about their old car. Be patient — you're asking details about a car that they owned a long time ago. A few specific questions are acceptable, but try not to steer the conversation too much. People tend to remember generalities rather than specifics. Try to ask questions that will just let the person talk — you never know what will come out. If the person is open to future contact, arrange to call again in a couple of weeks. Now that you have jogged their memory, additional details will probably come to mind. Be sure to give them your phone number in case any interesting thoughts come to mind before your next scheduled call.

Don't be disappointed if you can't complete the entire title history of your car. No amount of creativity can retrieve information that no longer exists. Be proud of what you are able to accomplish, not disappointed by what you are unable to complete. Most of all, enjoy the adventure.

# Red Baron

Mustang II owners are quick to point out that if it were not for the second generation ponies, there would be no Mustangs today. No Fox-chassis Mustangs, no 5.0 Mustangs, no SN95 Mustangs, nothing. The missing link that would continue the pony car legend for Ford was the Mustang II.

Our Mustang II was delivered to Sloan Motors Ford in April 1978. Covered in Bright Red paint with white wheels and red vinyl and checkered cloth interior, the little Mustang instantly grabbed the attention of every passerby.

Our daughter, Sandy, was six years old when my wife, Joan, buckled her in for trips around our West

Chester, Pennsylvania, neighborhood. But this Mustang was treated specially from the first day we tucked it into the garage. Its wiper blades rarely felt bad weather and trying to mush through snow was out of the question. It was a fair weather Mustang much to our delight.

Powered by a 302, the V8's muscle is linked to the rear wheels with a four-speed transmission. Front and rear sway bars make fun of tight, twisting turns that straighten out after being laughed at by the gas-filled shocks. Make no mistake — this Mustang II is all sports car.

The power rack and pinion steering is turned by a leather-wrapped steering wheel — one advantage of ordering the Rally package. Inside are contoured bucket seats, a full complement of gauges, and a fold-down rear seat.

When Sandy took to the road in 1988, she could hardly wait to drive "her" Mustang.

She quickly dubbed it the Red Baron and they headed out for new adventures.

Not every road was without its bumps, however. I hit a deer, Joan was hit by a driver making an illegal turn, and Sandy hit a tree learning to drive. All three bumps were fixed and the Baron kept on going.

A King Cobra front air dam has been installed and the sun-faded carpet has been replaced. The odometer is showing just over 58,000 miles and it's still a pleasure to drive. We often take the Baron to car shows and cruise nights where at least once a night we hear, "I used to have one of these Mustangs." MT





# A Way of Life

Bob Hill of Clovis, New Mexico, enjoys the power of Ford's big block engines. Throw in a little of the unusual and he's even happier. Bob was anxiously waiting for his 429 SCJ-equipped 1970 Ranchero to receive a top-notch paint job so he could complete his project and hit the show circuit. Unfortunately, problems kept the Ranchero out of the paint booth and after six years of waiting, Bob finally retrieved his unpainted truck.

Aware of Bob's dilemma, good friend Gerald Fisher passed along information about a beautiful Candyapple Red 1969 Mach 1 that was outfitted with a 428 Cobra Jet engine. Although Bob really wanted a Shelby if he were to venture into the Mustang world, he agreed to look at Gerald's find which was located in a shop in Albuquerque. Thoughts of a Shelby were put on the back burner and a deal was quickly made for the Mach 1. While Bob enjoyed a three-week vacation, shop owner Ernie Blumenthal finished up the restoration of the pony.

Although the car was in excellent

condition, there were a few odds and ends that were not correct. A Bronze award at the 1997 MCA Grand National in Mustang, Oklahoma, helped Bob pinpoint additional areas that needed attention. The expertise of Kerry Hubbell of Clovis was sought out. Having already restored several Gold winners, Bob knew his car would be in good hands.

The engine, transmission, gas tank and lines, suspension, and rear end were pulled for detailing. Since the 428 had been rebuilt in 1995 by Doug Anderson of Automotive Machine Service, only cosmetic work was needed. Bob's job was to scrape and clean the undercarriage which had not been touched. Ultimately, he spent 135 hours scraping off years of road dirt and gunk.

To make sure those little details were not overlooked, Kerry made notes as to the color and location of markings that were found.

Dave Woolsey of Dave's Coachcraft in Clovis was enlisted to prime the engine compartment, paint the

underside of the hood which had been damaged by battery acid, and paint the door jambs to match the nearly-new exterior paint.

Correct components that were located and installed included an NOS smog system, fan and clutch, snorkel, S-tube, heat shield, etc. However, installation of the correct items revealed a new problem. The fan would not clear the fan shroud. It was determined that incorrect motor mounts were the problem. Bob discovered from previous owner Ernie that the Mach's 428 had been installed in a Boss 302 and a 351 placed in the Mach. Ernie purchased the Boss along with the Mach to make sure he had the correct engine.

All of the time and effort that went into returning this SportsRoof to its glory days has been well worth it. Gold and first place awards are the norm these days.

Work is still ongoing with the 1970 Ranchero and a 1967 Shelby GT 500 has been added to the brood. Big blocks are just a way of life for some. MT

# Back in Town

**John Edge's '94 Boss Showcases the Team Shinoda Look**

You've got to admit that these really are the best of times if you're a Mustang fan. Never has any muscle car coupled so much power with modern amenities and clean emissions — and sold so well to boot! Even so, there's one particular SN95 bodystyle today that's truly a touchstone to times long past. That breed of pony car can be seen here with this 1994

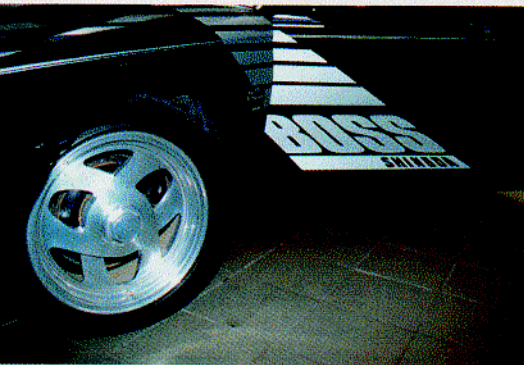
Boss Shinoda Mustang owned by John Edge of Pensacola, Florida.

"I'm a Ford man from way back and was brought up around them," John said when asked about his car. "I bought a plastic model of a '94 Boss, built it and had it sitting on my TV until 1996 when I finally saw one on a car lot. It had 8,900 miles on it. That was pretty much it as I decided I had to buy it no matter what they wanted for the car."

Getting his hands on this prize didn't do much to curb John's appetite. In fact, it only got him more interested in the legacy behind the car. Briefly told, the original Boss 302 was introduced in 1969 as part of a major counterattack on Chevrolet during the muscle car wars of the late '60s. Ford was looking to regain dominance of the SCCA Trans-Am circuit while providing an alternative to the

Camaro Z28 which was quickly gaining popularity. Special graphics coupled with suspension refinements and a 302 with redesigned cylinder heads resulted in a pony that was both nimble and quick. The Boss 429 and 351, each different in their own right, added to the name to make this the best series of Mustangs ever.

Although the 1969-70 Boss 302 was a significant muscle car in many ways, it was only one of the many notable creations that sprang forth from the mind of designer Larry Shinoda. Other cars such as the Mako Shark Corvette, the 1963 Stingray, the Camaro Z28, and even the Cougar Eliminator owed their visual appeal to Shinoda. Before his death in 1997, Shinoda operated a design studio in West Bloomfield, Michigan, and devised an updated Boss graphics package for the SN95



Mustang. He also was partly responsible for the very recent 1998 SVT Super Stallion concept car that offered a preview of the next Cobra. It was during this time that John contacted Shinoda about what to do to turn his car into the kind of late model Boss that the designer originally had in mind.

"All the car had was the graphics on it and that was it," John said. "I talked to Larry, sent him pictures of the car, and he told me what to do to finish it up. I had everything done, right down to the original Firehawk decals which were on the original car. He even signed the console of my car before he died."

Jim Klok, manager of Shinoda Performance Vehicles, told us more about John's car, how it came to be recognized as an official Boss Shinoda Mustang and more about the program as it stands today.

"This car was originally built as a regular Mustang with the standard package," Jim said. "After Larry passed away, we decided to allow those people like John who bought their cars between 1994 and 1997 to get their cars certified as a Generation I car. This means that every piece that Larry originally designed for the 1994 Boss Mustang is on that car."

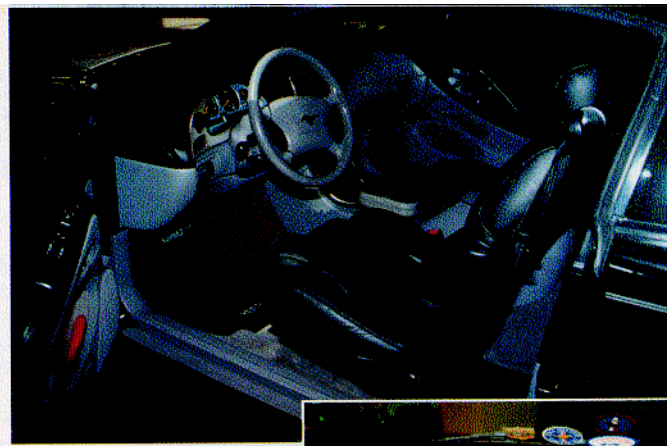
The Generation I designation is for the 1994-97 cars and includes a five-piece graphics package for the hood, Shinoda/Budnick wheels, a matte black front chin spoiler, a 15-inch rear spoiler, and a window visor and rear bumper decal. Generation II cars (for 1994-2000 Mustangs) come in two levels. The entry level kit includes the graphics package and other goodies with the most unique item being a 15-inch rear spoiler with cup holders so the owner has a place to put his favorite beverage during a Saturday night cruise stop. Level II cars come prepped for extra performance to go with their good looks by way of a Vortech supercharger, oversized mass air meter and throttle body, 18-inch wheels and tires, suspension bolt-ons, and 3.73:1 gearing.

"Dallas Mustang is the only authorized wholesale distributor of Shinoda Performance parts," Klok said when asked how Mustang own-

ers can transform their cars into Boss Shinodas. "There was a three-way agreement to let them develop the power while the Shinoda family and I would work together to get the correct appearance and Larry's daughter would authorize the final package before it would be released to the public. If you want a new vehicle, you can go to a Ford dealer, order the car the way you want it and tell them to dial (800) MUSTANG (687-8264). They will make the arrangements to have a car built in Dearborn and then it will be shipped to Dallas. Once they do that, you can pick your car up. You cannot find one on a dealership floor. A Shinoda car is built for the owner."

At the time of this writing, Jim advised us that there are only two authorized Generation I cars and just a handful of Generation II cars along with a Boss Shinoda Ranger and two Cobra Shinoda Mustangs. Plans are to expand the Shinoda program in the future to include the Ford Focus and F-150 offerings.

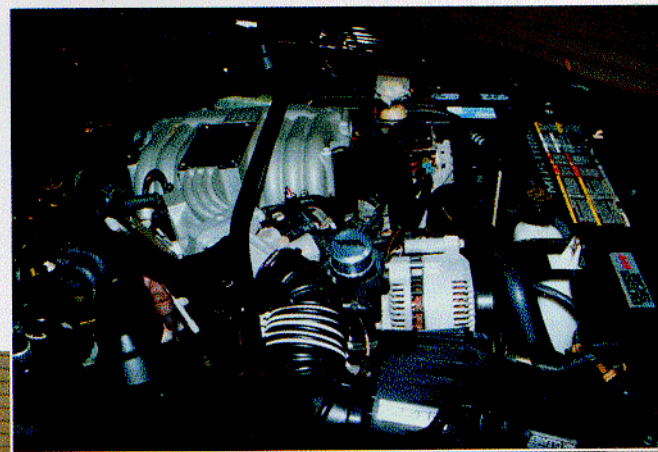
